Dear Parents/Carers

It has been a very busy and productive week within The Walderslade and Greenacre Schools Partnership. Our students continue to make us proud, as we continue to strive for high standards. I would like to remind all parents of a few areas:

Uniform Expectations

We have uniform requirements for both provisions. Our school uniform establishes pride and belonging and we request that you support us in ensuring our students wear their uniforms correctly:

Girls Provision

Fake/acrylic nails, false eyelashes/lash extensions and large jewellery are not permitted. I expect any student who has worn them this week to have them removed over the weekend, there will be no exceptions. If your daughter/ward fails to remove them, you will be contacted by a member of staff from the relevant year group and sanctions will be put in place.

A navy blue blazer with WGS emblem, a navy blue box pleated skirt with WGS emblem, a plain white (or striped) blouse - open neck, a navy blue school jumper with WGS emblem (optional), plain navy blue or black tights, plain navy blue or black socks. Plain black hard soled shoes, no canvas, no ankle boots, no high heels and no trainers. Plain navy blue or black hair accessories and plain navy blue or black head scarves.

Boys Provision

A black blazer featuring the Academy emblem, a plain white shirt, plain black trousers (please note that skinny or cropped trousers and jeans are not permissible), a GA tie, plain black hard-soled school shoes (trainers or plimsolls are not allowed), students have the option of wearing a plain black V-neck sweatshirt (Hoodies or sports jackets are not allowed). One small stud earring is permitted (no diamond earrings) and no other jewellery is permitted.

Passes

After careful consideration and evaluation, we may discontinue granting multiple passes to students and reduce the provision of passes only to those with verifiable medical or special educational needs. This decision has been made with the best interests of our students in mind and is based on several factors that we believe will contribute to a more productive and secure learning environment. Please note that this is being reviewed on a case by case basis and you will be contacted if your daughter/son/ward's pass is being removed.
