

## BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Art and Design, specialising in Fashion and Textiles


# Course requirements: GRADE 5 AT ART OR TEXTILES (AT TEACHERS DISCRETION.)

#### Understanding the course...

BTEC Extended Certificate in Art and Design, specialising in Fashion and Textiles is equivalent to 1 A-Level.

During the course, you will work through 2 internally and 2 externally set units including a written body of work. You will work on your portfolio, developing and refining your work. Throughout the 2 year course, your work will be reviewed and marked by an external moderator.

You will be graded at either Pass, Merit,
Distinction or Distinction\*. The BTEC Extended
Certificate is recognised by UCAS and is a gateway
to a BTEC Foundation Diploma or to a creative
Bachelor of Arts degree.

## Will it fit in my life?

BTEC Fashion will be perfect for you if you have a passion for creativity, a desire to succeed and an enthusiasm for making and styling clothes. It is a good complimentary subject for Art and Design or Photography and can be a good outlet for your creative skills. Fashion is not for the faint hearted, you must be dedicated, committed, motivated and prepared to work extremely hard.

#### What will I learn?

You will learn how to develop your design skills and will investigate a number of relevant practising designers and textiles artists. You will learn how to pattern cut, dye and manipulate fabrics, embroidery and basic sewing machine skills. You will explore computer aided design, screen printing and embellishment. You will be expected to create a collection of garments, considering how a designer uses outside inspiration to create. You will be encouraged to work outside the studio and will develop a cultural and critical understanding of the fashion industry in today's society.
